Council highlights ~ Jan. 17, 2023 mtg in person! **Council**

◆ Pastor's Report: Pastor Utecht is excited to start a new member class Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m.

◆ President's Report: David Seaver stated that in order to make council meetings more effective, we should allow individual committees to make decisions for their respective areas. The council would step in only if there were any controversial or financial considerations.

Church

- ◆ Vice President's Report: Dick Robertson reviewed the progress of the update to our phone system. We gathered information to decide whether to go with Spectrum or stay with AT&T. He is meeting with the Preschool Board and Director to discuss improving the entrance to the school to make it more welcoming, as well as the security. Dennis Werner is now coordinating the Usher program under direction of Dick as the Elder representative.
- ◆ Elder's Report: Luigi Uwanawich stated that each congregation family is assigned an Elder, and they are updating the list. Since many people don't know who their Elder is, it was suggested that Elder pictures be put up on the bulletin board. Dorene noted that the Caregivers could use more direction in working alongside the Elders.
- ◆ Mary & Martha Report: Dorene Rubin reported on their distribution of funds: Food for the Poor, Orphan Grain Train, Chicago Hope Church, Central Lutheran Church and Elizabeth House. The Cookie Walk will be held Sun., Feb.12, so start baking now! The Women's Bible Study resumes Sat., Feb. 11.
- ◆ Trustee Report: Larry Hanna informed us of a bid of \$20,000 for Heating/AC work that needs to be done. There are a number of projects in the works, whenever our financial situation gets better.
- ◆ Christian Education Report: Chris Gordon represented the Christian Education/Sunday School. Sunday School will be at 9:00 a.m. to accommodate those attending the New Member class. There is a small staff that covers all the programs supporting our children and their families, including the FEET program. Chris is requesting feedback from the Living Nativity event and is hoping more leaders will get involved next year.
- ◆ Outreach Committee Report: Rhonda shared they are creating a Holy Saturday service.

- ◆ School Board Report: Dorene Rubin reported on the increased School enrollment, 10 students, with 6 on the waiting list (not old enough yet to start). New floors were installed, a colorful new sign was put up on the Kester side fence, and lead testing is completed. The budget is still in the red, but doing better. Security issues were discussed, such as needing to change the gate code, programming the fobs, and responding to people who come up to the gate when children are present.
- ◆ Stewardship Committee Report: Laura Murcott was happy with the Christmas card they sent out to the congregation and regular attenders. Laura will work on getting a more complete list through Servant Keeper in the future.
- ◆ Treasurer's & Financial Secretary's Reports: Leslie & Heather shared that the financial reports still paint a picture that there is not enough money being received to cover the bills. Leslie and Heather provided the current financial reports. We have assets of \$150,800 in BofA savings (which includes several designated funds), \$10,500 in checking, and \$50,600 in the Lutheran Extension Fund. December's general fund contributions were \$18,400, with expenses being \$29,600. We have cut down on our spending as much as possible. More revenue is needed to stop dipping into savings each month. Council decided to cease special offering requests until we are better situated. We realize that many of our members are also financially strapped and are doing the best they can.
- ♦ New Business: A nominating committee was named for the next fiscal year. Larry and Rhonda will ask 3 members to be a part of the 5 person committee. A congregation survey will be created to get their perspectives of our church, including why or why not they attend in person.

There was a motion approved to give temporary veto power to the President on any expenses over \$1,000 until the end of the fiscal year (June). There is a lot of concern with our financial situation.

Heather and Leslie will investigate how we can use Servant Keeper to create a new **church directory**. We will add pictures provided by the members or pictures will be taken at events.

President David and Pastor will represent SOLC in voting on LCMS matters.

What Is Church Membership?

A Message from Pastor...

The Three C's of Membership

As I was recently preparing for our new members class, this thought struck me: Have you ever realized just how many different types of "memberships" there are in our world? You can be a member of a grocery store, family, country club, gang, gym, political party, flight crew, cult, etc. "Membership" has all sorts of different meanings! So what in the world does it mean to be a member of the church?

After some reflection, I boiled it down to what I call "the three C's" of membership: confession, community, and crew. I pray that you take some time to consider each of these and reflect upon what it means that you are a member of this church.

Confession. To be a member of a church is to make a *confession* that you believe what the church teaches. We occasionally have visitors at our service who find Christianity to be a good and interesting cultural phenomenon, but they would not confess Jesus Christ as the Son of God and their Savior. Accordingly, they certainly wouldn't become members, because to do so would be to signal that they personally subscribe to what our church teaches. Yet making this confession is important. In fact, the opening lines from the rite of new membership starts off with Jesus' words about confession: "Whoever *confesses* me before men. I will also confess before my Father who is in heaven." (Matt. 10:32) From there, the candidates are asked questions about whether they believe in Jesus, our church's teaching, and if they will be faithful to Jesus "even to death." Most of you have probably answered these questions, either as a youth at confirmation or more recently. It was a serious and important confession, and it is really the central aspect of church membership.

Community. The second aspect of membership is that it means that you are part of this community. God has desired that His children not live as isolated Christians, but that they become part of a body of believers who meet together and encourage one another (Heb. 10:24-25), to love and care for each other (John 13:35, 1 Pet. 2:17), to worship together and receive the Lord's Supper together (Acts 2:42, 1 Cor. 11:17-34), and more. Each of these blessings is something that God has designed for His children to receive in community, and so being a member of this church means that you are committed to being part of this community and receiving those blessings together with us.

Crew. The last aspect of membership is that it means to become part of our church "crew" and work in carrying out the work and mission of the church. I once heard it said that if the church were a boat, there would be no passengers, only crew members. The work of the church is carried out and supported by the people of God who give their time, resources, skills, donations, and more. Literally every single bit of carrying out the work of the kingdom at SOLC and beyond happens through the people of God working as part of the "crew." This is not just the work that a select handful do, but all of us. Ultimately it is God who carries out the work of the kingdom, but God always chooses to work through God's people. To be a member of this church is to say with Isaiah....

"Here am I! Send me." (ls. 6:8)
