A Message from the Pastor... **The Work of the District**

I write this newsletter to you from Ann Arbor, MI, where I (along with Laura Warshawsky) have travelled to in order to attend the English District Convention. The convention is a gathering of one pastor and one lay member from every church in the English District (~160 churches) and happens every three years. For this month's Oakleaves I thought I'd share a few updates so that you all might know a bit more about the important work that our church body is doing. All of this work is

supported by the member congregations of the District, which means that it is ultimately supported by you.

The events of the convention fall under 4 categories: ministry updates, fellowship, teaching, and business.

Ministry Updates: During the convention, we get updates and reports from all of the various ministries supported by the English District. This includes hearing about all the

support the English District is giving to a Lutheran church body in the Dominican Republic as it journeys to becoming a selfsustaining entity, learning about various campus ministries and other missions supported by the District, new church plants, etc.

Fellowship: There is great encouragement from gathering with over a hundred fellow church leaders who are able to share ideas, encouragement, and prayer for each other in the ministry. I am part of the District's "Mission Action Team" that supports new church plants and I have been able to see and encourage in-person members from a church plant in Texas I've been supporting and also members from a team starting a new campus

Please continue to pray not only for the work of our congregation at SOLC, but also for the work of the English District, the LCMS, and the work of God's church throughout the world.

Teaching: The conventions always feature teaching so we can continue to grow and learn together as church leaders. This year Rev. Dr. Chad Kendall is presenting on "protreptics," an ancient form of apologetics that seeks to lead skeptics to faith. We've learned about Clement of Alexandria, a 2nd Century Christian and how he would engage his pluralistic culture that was happy to take bits of wisdom from Christianity and other

sources, but was skeptical of absolute truth claims (sound familiar?). It's been a
fascinating and useful presentation. Feel free to ask me more about it when I'm back!

Business: We also carry out
CMS, and
the "business" of the church
through elections, voting,
etc. Bishop Miskus (who
visited us in March) was
elected to continue as
Bishop. We've begun voting

on various motions relating to things such as further supporting campus ministries, encouraging unity in the church, promoting and supporting 1st Communion, etc.

I also just want to share that the whole gathering is very godly and exactly what you would hope for and expect from such a gathering of church leaders. It is bathed in prayer, Spirit-led, and the discourse is godly and respectful even when there is disagreement.

Please continue to pray not only for the work of our congregation at SOLC, but also for the work of the English District, the LCMS, and the work of God's church throughout the world.
