
From Thanksgiving through December every year, SOLC Christmas Radio plays 24/7 on Live365.com! This unique station sounds exactly like a regular radio





A Message from the Head Elder

Look For God, Daily

Looking for God's work in our daily lives begins with cultivating an attitude of awareness. Scripture teaches that God reveals Himself to those who intentionally seek Him. Jeremiah 29:13 promises, "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." This verse encourages us to approach each day with openness, trusting that God is present even in the ordinary moments we might otherwise overlook.

One meaningful way to notice God's work is by paying attention to the people He places in our path. Acts of kindness, compassion, or forgiveness often reflect God working through human relationships. Jesus teaches in John 13:34-35, "A new command I give you: Love one another... By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." When we see genuine love in action—whether through service, patience, encouragement, or empathy—it becomes a visible sign of God's presence moving among us.

Another way to recognize God's presence is by observing the natural world. Creation itself reflects the ongoing work of a Creator who sustains life each day. Romans 1:20 explains that "God's invisible qualities... have been clearly seen,

being understood from what has been made." Whether in the beauty of a sunrise, the rhythm of the seasons, or the quietness of a starry night, the natural world points our hearts back to God and reminds us of His power and creativity.

We can also discern God's work through moments of inner guidance and unexpected strength. Sometimes clarity appears when we need it most, or we find courage beyond our own ability. Isaiah 41:10 offers reassurance: "Fear not, for I am with you... I will strengthen you, I will help you." These experiences remind us that God's presence is not only external but also active within our hearts and minds.

Ultimately, noticing God's work in daily life is not about searching for dramatic miracles but about learning to see with a grateful and attentive spirit. James 1:17 reminds us that "every good and perfect gift is from above," inviting us to recognize blessings both large and small as evidence of God's care. When we reflect on each day with intention, we begin to realize that God hasn't just touched our lives occasionally—He has been faithfully walking beside us, daily, in every step.
