



Council highlights Feb. 21, 2023 mtg in person!

The council is changing its format for more productive

meetings. The members gave their reports at the beginning, without interruption, and then questions and discussion took place during the problem solving/action items portion of the meeting.

Church

Council

- ◆ Pastor's Report: Pastor Utecht summarized the success of the New Member classes and received them on Sunday, 2/19 (see pic on the cover & page 3.) Some of the families were already attending church, but took the official step to become members on February 19.
- ◆ President's Report: David Seaver reported that he and Pastor Utecht will represent SOLC in voting for the LCMS President.
- ♦ Vice President's Report: Dick Robertson announced we are in the final stages of Spectrum internet/phone systems installation. We will save approximately \$150/month with this new plan.
- ◆ Elder's Report: Dick reported the Elders continue to make attempts to communicate with members who haven't attended for awhile. It has been a challenge for them to get return calls.
- ◆ Treasurer's & Financial Secretary's Reports: Leslie O'Byrne and Heather Wolter discussed the financial reports. Rhonda has helped out with some of the technical issues of getting numbers more easily understood. The Financial Institution Report and Budget Performance Report were in draft form due to Liz being sick and out of the office for a week. The General Fund total for January is \$14,247.62.
- ◆ Mary & Martha Report: Dorene Rubin reported that the cookie walk received about \$400 that will be distributed among their mission projects. The Women's Bible Study will meet the second Saturday of each month at 9:00 a.m. and will have three business meetings per year.
- ◆ School Board Report: Dorene Rubin announced that the School Board will be preparing the budget soon. Netting on the fences are being explored to provide more security. Three new students will join the school in March.

- ◆ Trustee Report: Larry Hanna reported the Trustees are soliciting bids for heating/air conditioning work. In addition, he is getting a roofer to assess our roofing needs.
- ◆ Stewardship Committee Report: Laura Murcott is checking the LCMS website for stewardship ideas. She brought up the possibility of having an acknowledgement card to put in the plate for those who give online.
- ◆ Outreach Committee Report: Rhonda Renneker and Outreach are planning Holy Week services. They are also analyzing inventory to make sure they are prepared.
- ◆ Christian Education Report: Chris Gordon was unable to attend but David reported for her. They held a "meet and greet" with church, staff, and SOLCC parents during Lutheran Schools Week. We have 3 new Sunday School teachers starting since we have a 9:00 am Sunday School in addition to the Sermon lesson time. Sonia will continue scheduling our nursery The FEET program met Feb. 26 volunteers. to explore with families the "Personal Quiet Time with the Lord."
- ♦ New Business: Dorene asked how to connect the Caregivers and Elders to better serve our members. This will be discussed at the next Elders meeting. In addition, the Elder lists will be posted on the bulletin board.

A new pictorial church directory is being created through Servant Keeper. Members will need to submit their picture so they can be included in the pictorial directory.

A survey will be sent out to all members in the near future to evaluate how we are doing as a church and where we might improve.

The **nominating committee** of Rhonda, Larry, Emily and Tahirih needs one more congregation volunteer. In an effort to help our church grow, we want to know what special skills/ interests our new members have, as well as, skills/interests of our long time members.

A Message from Pastor...

The Peacemaker

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. - Matthew 5:9

Conflict is a very real part of our human existence. From small scale disagreements like where to go out for dinner to big conflicts that tear families and friends apart, conflict can get quite ugly and do a lot of damage to relationships.

However, we as Christians are uniquely prepared to deal with conflict, and when we really put into practice Biblical principles for handling conflict, it can transform our relationships in a powerful way. This is what Jesus is talking about when he says "blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God."

The reason that Christians can be peacemakers and thus be called "sons of God" is all because of THE Son of God, Jesus Christ. You see, each one of us was once caught up in a great and terrible conflict that was marked with betrayal, separation, hurt, hostility, and anything but peace. This conflict was none other than our conflict with God. That was the case until Jesus Christ. the Son of God, "broke down the dividing wall of hostility," "reconciled us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility," and now "he himself is our peace." (Eph. 2:14-16) The work of Jesus Christ was to end the conflict that existed between myself and God on account of my sin and instead to establish complete peace between us. Fundamentally, Jesus is a peacemaker.

Since Jesus has now made peace between God and man, he calls each one of us to carry out that same task of bringing peace and reconciliation to our human relationships. The Christian life should be marked by complete peace with others, and especially within the family of God.

Imagine a world in which you had no standing conflicts with others. Or perhaps a world in which all the conflicts and disagreements you had with anyone were resolved in a meaningful but peaceful way. A world in which you could look around at every other human being on this planet and say "I am at total peace with this person, and in my heart I hold nothing but Christian love for them." This is actually how we as Christians are called and equipped to live! We are to be peacemakers.

Peacemaking is beautiful and it is a great blessing (<u>blessed</u> are the peacemakers!), but it sure isn't easy or cheap. For Jesus, it literally cost him his life to make peace between God and man. So too for us, making peace in the midst of conflict requires boldness to address the situation in the first place, humility to confess our own role in the conflict, and a heart that is willing to forgive and love like Jesus.

Ultimately, peacemaking is letting Christ's work of reconciliation become our work. Over the course of the four weekends in March, we will have a sermon series on "**The**

Peacemaker" and work in more detail into just how we live these things out. It is my hope and prayer that this can be a powerful and even life changing topic of study. That might sound like a bold claim, but I must say that my life was quite transformed when I began to learn and apply these principles. (I also still have much room to grow, and I'm hoping that this series provides a good opportunity also for me to grow in my peacemaking!) Really, the transformational power of peacemaking shouldn't surprise us, given that peacemaking is nothing other than simply living out the powerful Gospel that has already transformed our lives.
